

SYNOPSIS

Draft Night follows the intense internal journey of a basketball prodigy, known to us only as Number One (Joseph David-Jones of 4400, Detroit, and Arrow), as he's passed over by NBA teams again and again on the night of the NBA draft. His sports agent, Caldwell (Justin Prentice of 13 Reasons Why), urges him to trust in the system. However, ill-equipped to deal with the perceived failure and the weight of his own ambition, Number One's frustration builds and boils over into an anxiety attack. Both his Pops (Shawn Williams) and his Mama (Gloria Stingily) attempt to intervene in their own ways, but it's ultimately up to Number One to figure out if he has the capacity to hold multiple truths as he fights against external forces he cannot control.

Number One is a young basketball prodigy expecting to be picked #1 overall in the NBA draft.



"POPS"

Portrayed by Shawn Williams

Pops is a pragmatic father who wants his son to have what he did not.



"CALDWELL"

Portrayed by Justin Prentice

Caldwell is a charismatic agent with dreams of catapulting to the A-list alongside Number One.



"MAMA"

Portrayed by Gloria Stingily

Mama is an empowering mother who encourages her son to make his own choices.



"COUSIN"

Portrayed by Destiny Ekwueme

Cousin is a fun-loving individual with an unapologetic lack of filter.



"SUPERFAN"

Portrayed by Corey Gifft

Superfan is a young, enthusiastic fan of Number One.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Draft Night is a character-driven narrative that delves deep into the hopes, dreams, and challenges that come with the pursuit of success; it takes a hard look at the complexities of identity, ambition, and the impact of societal and familial expectations.

I first came across *Draft Night* at a monologue competition in Manhattan. On the surface, both the monologue and the film are very much about the commodification of Black athletes. But what really resonated for me—as someone who has spent a significant portion of my career dissecting how we send young adults into the world via producing *13 Reasons Why* and curating a development slate of similarly themed shows—was the story of a young man ill-equipped to deal with what he perceives as failure. So I reached out to the writer/performer, Shawn Williams, and we began collaborating on an adaptation about a juvenile athlete burdened by the weight of the expectations he places on himself to "save" his family through basketball.

One of the major challenges of this film is generating empathy for a protagonist on the brink of immense financial success. We made it even harder for ourselves by choosing to introduce him as self-assured, brash, and boisterous. By portraying his emotional immaturity and exposing his internal conflicts and vulnerabilities behind the masks he wears to cope with his anxieties, however, we hope to invite the audience to feel the turmoil boiling beneath the exterior.

We collaborated with mental health experts to help us authentically navigate the paradoxical complexities of the journey—how the pursuit of one's dreams can simultaneously uplift and challenge, empower and confine. Their insights led us to a portrayal of Generalized Anxiety stemming from the Yerkes-Dodson model of high achieving performance. We experience the positive self-talk that propels our protagonist forward as well as the mounting pressure of excessive worry and negative thought patterns that builds into an anxiety attack.

As the director, my vision for *Draft Night* is to present an intimate and thought-provoking exploration of the human experience of a high performing individual. It's a story about basketball without any basketball. It is a call for empathy, understanding, and change, urging us to reevaluate how we nurture and shape the young men and women we send into the world.

Director Tom Glinkowski

Tom Glinkowski's career began at Marvel Studios during the first three phases of the MCU. Working on that iconic franchise gave him the opportunity to learn storytelling, production, and creative direction from some of the most talented professionals in the business. In Phase 2 of his own career, he worked directly with a number of accomplished filmmakers including writers Rhett Reese and Paul Wernick, Oscar-winning director Tom McCarthy, and Pulitzer Prize and Tony-winning writer Brian Yorkey. Tom most recently creatively produced Netflix's limited series *Echoes* and all four seasons of Netflix's *13 Reasons Why*.



Writer / "Pops" Shawn Williams

Shawn Williams is an actor, writer, and director. His appreciation for versatility is what encourages him to play a variety of roles, ranging from Paul in *Six Degrees of Separation*, to Aaron in *Titus Andronicus*. Shawn is an eight-time champion of the Manhattan Monologue Slam Competition, which he credits for giving him a platform to develop his solo show, *Shape Shifter*. Shawn also teaches Shakespeare and scene study for the world-renowned Stella Adler Conservatory, where he recently directed a production of Edward Albee's *The Goat, or Who is Sylvia?* His arts education experience extends through his work with Bank Street College of Education and ArtsConnection, and as a proud member of Family Life Theatre (FLT).



Director of Photography Kenzen Takahashi

Kenzen Takahashi is a cinematographer based out of Los Angeles. He got his start as a union grip, learning to light from renowned professionals on productions such as Netflix's 13 Reasons Why, The Matrix Resurrections, and All the Old Knives. From there, Kenzen went on to shoot short films, music videos, commercials, and most recently, a feature film starring Shiloh Fernandez and John Farley. Kenzen's work has been featured in articles by Sony and DoPchoice.

Jillian, Sierra, and Avery are a producing team based in Los Angeles and the Bay Area with a passion for bringing indie shorts to life and helping them find their audience in the festival circuit. Costume Designer Amanda Ramirez

Her costume design credits include The Last Black Man in San Francisco, Discreet, and short films Customer Service, Thirteen, Mime Games, Vessel, and The Break Up Message. Amanda also is an experienced costumer with credits on a vast number of features and TV shows. She loves to ride motorcycles, hit the waves, read comics, cook and create fun and unique garments with her 1960s Singer sewing machine. And she has a very unhealthy obsession with Star Wars.



Composer Greg Smith

A Grammy-nominated composer, Greg's music has appeared in numerous films and hundreds of TV shows across all the major networks. Additionally, he has composed the musical themes for many entertainment brands including Fuse TV and several networks in the Disney and Universal families of channels.

Scott R. Lewis, an Emmy award-winning sound engineer at Skywalker Sound, has won Outstanding Sound Mixing once and received a total of six nominations for his work on *House of Cards, Cinema Verite* and *Moon Knight*. His recent credits include *Loki, The Mandalorian, Obi-Wan Kenobi, The Book of Boba Fett, Top Gun: Maverick, A Teacher, Mindhunter*, and many others.

After starting his professional editing career working on all five seasons of The CW's *iZombie*, Tuan went on to edit television shows such as *Love Victor*, *The Wilds*, *Echoes*, *AZNBBGRL* and *Goosebumps*. Tuan has also edited a feature documentary, a feature film and several television pilots.

And on television, David-Jones starred in The CW's *Arrow* and DC's *Legends of Tomorrow* as well as CMT's *Nashville*. 
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A Black basketball prodigy struggles with the burden of single-handedly saving his family from hardship on the night of the NBA draft.

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
